

Dear parents/carers,

Due to school closure we will be providing work for the children so they can continue their learning at home.

The links to the teaching PowerPoints, activities and links to supporting websites will be posted on to your child's year group's Class Dojo story.

Our expectations for children and parents will be to use Class Dojo to share the children's completed work with their teachers and teaching assistants by posting to their personal portfolios/Class Dojo pages. The completed work may be shared via a photograph/video of the work completed on paper or a text response with title of the work attached to it.

EYFS children can also post their home learning onto their Tapestry profile which will feed into the EYFS assessments at the end of the year.

They will receive regular feedback on their work from their teachers or teaching assistants via Class Dojo. Teaching staff will be available via Class Dojo for questions and support during school hours (8:30 – 2:45).

To make this accessible for as many children as possible, we will provide children with QR codes to access their portfolio and information for the children which will link them to their personal portfolios. Alternatively, the children's work can be posted onto their portfolio through the parent app or via Dojo website without the need to create a profile themselves as you can do currently.

For reading, children are expected to be reading at home twice a day for at least 15 minutes.

We also have subscriptions to many educational websites: TTRockstars, Numbots, Purple Mash, Spelling League, KS2 only – MyMaths, Prodigy.

Please note that some companies (e.g. Twinkl, Classroom Secrets Kids, Teacher's Pet) are providing free learning packs for home learning in addition to the work provided by school.

Children in EYFS and KS1 will need the support of parents to share their work with teachers.

Also, the children in KS2, who know their log in username and password for the school laptops and Chromebooks, can use this log in on [www.Office.com](http://www.Office.com) to gain access to Microsoft Software online to complete any work required.

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To log in to Office.com at home, as their email address:

- Year 6 need to use hpp-12(first two letters of their first name followed by the first two letters of their second name)@harpfieldprimaryacademy.org.uk as the email address.
- Year 5 need to use hpp-13(first two letters of their first name followed by the first two letters of their second name)@harpfieldprimaryacademy.org.uk as the email address.
- Year 4 need to use hpp-14(first two letters of their first name followed by the first two letters of their second name)@harpfieldprimaryacademy.org.uk as the email address.
- Year 3 need to use hpp-15(first two letters of their first name followed by the first two letters of their second name)@harpfieldprimaryacademy.org.uk as the email address.

e.g. A child in year 4 named John Smith would use:

[hpp-14josm@harpfieldprimaryacademy.org.uk](mailto:hpp-14josm@harpfieldprimaryacademy.org.uk)

This would take him to a familiar log in page (see below) that he would use in school to access his Office365 (which includes an online version of Microsoft Word, Microsoft PowerPoint and other Microsoft products). He could then complete his work on those products and post them onto his Class Dojo portfolio for his teacher to look at and give feedback.)
