
Year 5 - Autumn 2 Newsletter

The following learning is planned this term:



Maths: This half term Year 5 will be working on Fractions. The class will learn about improper fractions, mixed numbers, adding and subtracting fractions and recognising equivalent fractions. Please make sure you are making the most of all the online practise sites we have e.g. TimesTables Rockstars, Numbots, Prodigy...to secure the skills we are practising at school.

Literacy: This half term Year 5 will continue to read the class text of 'The Boy At The Back Of The Class'. We will be writing a non-chronological report and a diary entry. We will continue learning new spelling rules and spelling homework will be sent out from next week



PE: This will go back to being on a **Tuesday**. PE will be led by Bee Active for this half term. Please remember to wear the correct PE kit (see image to the right) and remove all earrings. Children with long hair should have it tied up for PE too.

Topic: our topic for this half term is the **The Americas-** including Mexico. We will be learning about the physical and human features of Mexico and comparing it to the UK.



DT: We will start this half term with a DT block learning about Gears and Pulleys. Our big question is: How can you lift a car onto a roof?

Computing: Computing will be centred around Creating Media focussing on Video editing specifically.

RE: We will be learning about Christianity this half term. Our big question will be 'Is the Christmas Story True?'

Science: Our science learning this half term will be focussed on Forces. The class will learn about friction, air resistance, water resistance, levers, gears and pulleys. They will also develop their understanding of working scientifically.
