

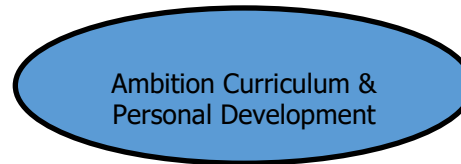


ENRICHMENT
