PE

Reading

Please ensure that your child reads at least 4 times a week at home. It really does make a difference to their reading progress.

Top tips for reading with your child:

- Discuss the meaning of words to expand their knowledge of vocabulary in order to understand texts.
- Identify key aspects of fiction and non-fiction texts, such as characters, events, titles and information.
- Identify and explain the sequence of events in texts.
- Make inferences to the text (reading between the lines - using their own knowledge and evidence from the text).
- Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far.
